NewsBank provides a comprehensive collection of reliable news sources covering a wide array of topics and issues.

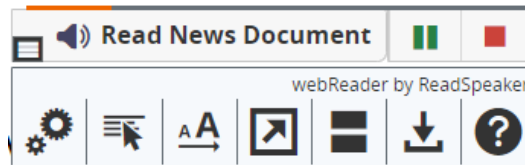

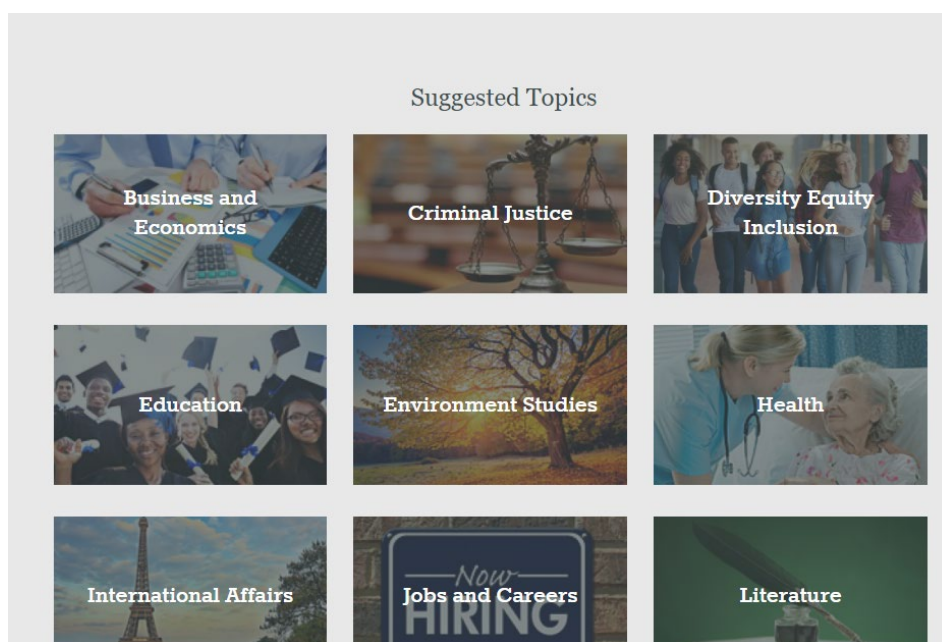

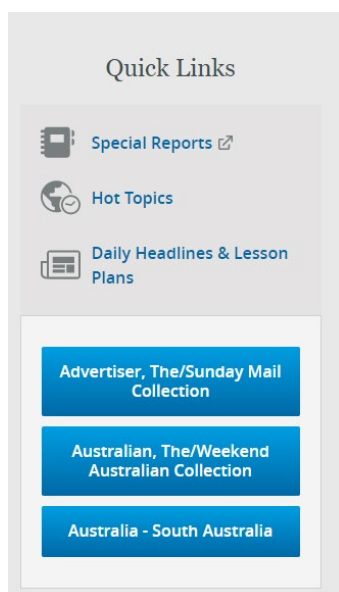
More search options lets you refine your search by date range or by lexile (reading) level. You can also use a map to refine by location.
